Covid-19.

The vast majority of apprentices are under 20 and are very unlikely to contract the Coronavirus, or suffer any serious health-related consequences.



However, their health and safety, and that of our clients team members and employer partners is of utmost importance. Every action that we take to prevent the virus spreading makes the UK safer for everyone, reducing the negative impact to people and businesses including hairdressing salons and barbers who deliver

apprenticeship training, and the wider general public.

Please remind your colleagues, team, apprentices, clients and visitors to follow and promote the public health advice being given:

- Frequent hand washing
- Avoid touching your face, eyes and mouth



 Sneezing etiquette guidelines including Making sure you, and the people around you, follow good respiratory hygiene: cover your mouth and nose with your bent elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze, and dispose of the used tissue immediately.

- Maintain social distancing of at least 2 metres distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing.
- Use Elbow High Five instead of hand shaking/social cheek-kissing for a welcoming but professional greeting
- Use the NHS 111 online, wherever possible, and pharmacies, GPs and hospitals <u>only when you really need to</u>. See the NHS website: <u>When to go to A&E</u>
